- Ros Chantraboth. Prof. of History at the Royal University of Phnom Penh and advisor to teh Royal Academy of Cambodia.
- Sambo Manara. Deputy Director of the History Department at the Royal University of Phnom Penh, Mr. Manara also teaches at other universities. He holds an MA in history from California State University and was the Cambodian expert on our panel to review the draft of A History of Democratic Kampuchea before publication.
- David Chandler. Professor Emeritus of history at Monash University, Dr. Chandler is a renowned historian of Cambodia, whose published works include The Tragedy of Cambodian History: Politics, War, and Revolution since 1945, Brother Number One: A Political Biography of Pol Pot, and Voices from S-21. He was DC-Cam's lead advisor on the development of the textbook.
- Frank Chalk. Former Chair of the Montreal Holocaust Memorial Museum and director of Montreal Institute for Genocide and Human Rights Studies, Dr. Chalk is a history professor at Concordia University. He is also an advisor to the project. From August to November 2005, Khamboly Dy, our team leader, audited two of Dr. Chalk's courses and worked with him on the text's content and organization.
- Alexander Hinton. Associate Professor of anthropology at Rutgers University, Dr. Hinton is internationally recognized for his research on the Cambodian genocide. His most recent book is Why Did They Kill? Cambodia in the Shadow of Genocide. He also serves as the advisor to four of our staff who are studying for advanced degrees at Rutgers and is a frequent advisor to DC-Cam.
- Elizabeth Van Schaack. Associate Professor of Law at Santa Clara University, USA. She was formerly a lecturer in the Department of Politics and International Relations at Lancaster University (1973-1994) and has held visiting appointments at Chulalongkorn University (Thailand) and Cornell University (USA). A specialist on political change and development in Cambodia, and on aspects of democratization in Asian political systems, she is a regular contributor to international conferences. She is currently engaged in research on forced migration, inequality and democratic governance in Cambodia

• Dr. John D. Cirociari. Stanford University is a National Fellow of the Hoover Institution at Stanford. His current research centers on the alignment policies of small states and middle powers in the Asia-Pacific region. He is also a Senior Legal Advisor to DC-Cam. He has published a range of scholarly works on international criminal law and the Khmer Rouge accountability process.
