Genocide Education in Cambodia
The Teaching of "A History of Democratic Kampuchea (1975-1979)"

Sixth Commune Teacher Training Program August 20-26, 2011 Kampong Chhnang Province

Andrew Cayley, International Co-Prosecutor of the Khmer Rouge Tribunal, will present a paper on "Why Education Matter for the Legal Process?" and lead a Q&A session with the teachers in the morning of August 22nd.

The first textbook on Khmer Rouge history, *A History of Democratic Kampuchea* (1975-1979), written by Khamboly Dy, was published in 2007. This textbook was reviewed by the Government Reviewing Committee and finally approved to be the supplementary material for the teaching of DK history in secondary schools throughout Cambodia. It has been distributed for free to students at lower and uppersecondary schools across the country.

In 2009, in collaboration with the Ministry of Education, DC-Cam produced a companion Teacher's Guidebook to the DK history textbook. The guidebook is designed especially so that history teachers will be able to use the DK history textbook objectively and pedagogically. In addition, a student workbook is being finalized for publication.

From June 29 to August 7, 2009, DC-Cam held a workshop to train 24 national teachers from the Ministry of Education and 15 DC-Cam staff members on the methodology to teach the DK history and related topics such as the experience of in other countries of genocides and mass atrocities. International and national scholars were invited to participate and assist the workshop. In late 2009, DC-Cam in collaboration with the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sport, conducted the second national training workshop for 180 provincial teachers. In 2010, commune level training workshops were conducted with the participation of 834 history teachers from 18 provinces.

The fourth teacher training was conducted on April 5-11, 2011 with 144 participants from Kandal province and Phnom Penh. The fifth commune teacher training was conducted on June 24-30, 2011 in the Kampong Cham Regional Teacher Training School with 72 participants. The sixth commune teacher training will be conducted from **August 20-26, 2011**. Seventy-two history teachers from Kampong Chhnang province are invited to attend.
